2025-26 PARKING QUICK GUIDE

PERMITS

The purchase of a permit does not guarantee a parking space, but merely allows for legal parking in specific areas of the campus.

Permits are required from 7 a.m. - 10 p.m. (unless otherwise noted by a sign). This is in effect whenever the university is open, including when classes are not in session and during semester breaks. Permits are not required after 10 p.m. except in the following areas:

- > Any lot or space(s) signed 24-hour parking
- University Bookstore Lot (meters) must be paid continuously, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
- North End Parking Garage
- > Alexandria Building One lots

Parking permits may be purchased at parking.vt.edu or in person at Parking Services. Faculty, staff, and students must present their Hokie Passport and vehicle registration.

Permits may be purchased using cash, check, credit card, or Hokie Passport. Eligible faculty, staff, and graduate assistants may purchase permits using payroll deduction for yearly and spring semester permits during the enrollment period. Eligible students may also pay for their permits through their student accounts during specific permit purchase enrollment periods.

FACULTY/STAFF PARKING

Faculty and staff may park in Faculty/Staff, Commuter, Graduate, and Resident parking areas. Parking is not allowed in areas restricted by signs, such as service vehicle areas, visitor spaces, metered spaces, and admissions guest areas. F/S daily permits are not permitted in the North End Garage. Failure to promptly return your parking permit to Virginia Tech Parking Services upon separation from the University will result in the remaining balance being deducted from your final paycheck or billed.

COMMUTER AND GRADUATE STUDENT PARKING

Commuter and graduate students may park in Commuter sections of Litton-Reaves, Duck Pond, Track/ Field House, Smithfield Road, Coliseum, and any resident space not marked as restricted. Parking is prohibited in signed areas such as service vehicle, visitor, metered, 24-hour, or reserved areas.

Perry Street permit holders may park in the C/G sections and in any other valid C/G/R spaces on campus, not restricted by signs. Students may also buy a lower-cost **Remote permit** valid only in the off-campus lot at 1602 Innovation Drive (Smoot and Innovation) with walking or shuttle access to campus.

Graduate-only spaces are available in the Squires Lot and around the GLC Circle.

OAK LANE COMMUNITY

Residents of the Oak Lane Community must purchase a resident parking permit to park in the Oak Lane Community. See Resident Student Parking for additional information.

RESIDENT STUDENT PARKING

Resident students may park in the Resident sections of the Stadium Lot, Chicken Hill Lot, and the Duck Pond Drive Lot. The following lots will be restricted during home athletic events: Stadium Lot, Chicken Hill Lot, and the perimeter of the Duck Pond Drive Lot.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

Overnight parking on campus (2 - 6 a.m.) is prohibited except for authorized university business, with prior approval from Parking Services. Residents displaying a Resident parking permit can ONLY park in resident parking lots overnight.

LOADING/UNLOADING

Before loading or unloading, individuals with a current permit should call Parking Services at 540-231-3200 and ask to be "green-logged." This allows individuals to park in certain spaces for up to 30 minutes to load or unload.

BOOTING

Vehicles can be booted under the following conditions:

- Receiving five or more citations in a semester
- > Accumulating a balance of \$350 or more
- > Having an unpaid balance that is 120 days past due
- > Display a lost or stolen permit

To have a boot removed:

Pay the balance for all unpaid citations either online at parking.vt.edu or in person at Parking Services.

Note: After the fifth citation, a boot will be issued for each repeat offense.

TOWING

Vehicles are towed at the owner's expense under the following circumstances:

- An outstanding balance of \$350 or more in unpaid citations and late fees
- If a boot has not been removed within 36 hours
- Creating a public safety concern, such as obstruction of traffic flow
- If more than 10 citations have been received within an academic year
- Parking in a handicap zone, fire lane, loading dock, roadway, Faculty Principle spaces, emergency snow route, or in violation of athletic parking restrictions

CITATIONS parking.vt.edu/citations

Parking citations range from \$35 - \$300, depending on th offense and must be paid or appealed within 10 calendar days to prevent late fees.

APPEALS

Appeals must be made online by going to parking.vt.edu or in writing on a Parking Services Appeals Form (available at Parking Services) within 10 calendar days of ticket issuance. Directions can be found on the back of the citation.

PARKMOBILE

ParkMobile can be used in any parking meter, campus parking space, or lot that has standard F/S, C/G, or R parking. This does not apply to 24-hour restricted lots, or spaces designated for specific groups - Service Vehicle, etc.

While using ParkMobile, faculty and staff, commuters, graduates, and resident students must park in their correct affiliated areas on campus. Students cannot use ParkMobile to park in F/S spaces/lots.

EVENING ONLY

This is a great permit option if you only need to be on campus in the evenings. The EO permit will allow you to park in any regular F/S (NOT FS 24 HR) or student space after 5 p.m. If you already have a F/S, resident, commuter, or graduate permit, you will not need this permit to park at night or after 5 p.m.

DINING HALL ENFORCEMENT

Parking regulations near the Dining Halls will be strictly enforced due to congestion.
